Each patient makes progress based on individual medical needs and potential. The multidisciplinary team will continuously monitor your progress and evaluate goals until they determine you are ready for discharge.

Upon discharge, you may be referred to home health, outpatient rehabilitative services, an assisted living facility or skilled nursing facility for additional therapies or nursing care to help your long term recovery goals.

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## The Program

Whether hospitalized at Abbeville Area Medical Center or at another hospital, our Swing Bed Rehabilitation program is open to any qualifying patient who wishes to transfer here for care. The program enables patients to stay in the hospital setting for short term rehabilitation needs when speech, occupational or physical therapy, and/or nursing, wound, IV antibiotic, or respiratory care is needed.

Criteria for admission into Swing Bed Rehab is dependent upon approval by insurance. A physician referral is also required along with acceptance by a multidisciplinary team that includes a physician, case manager, therapists and nursing staff.

Patients from other hospitals are also eligible to transfer here for admission into the program, allowing the added benefit of receiving

continued care near family, friends and other local support.

The average length of stay is 14 days, dependent upon insurance authorization/approval and based on your specific needs.

## Treated Conditions

Every patient's care is unique to their situation and health status. We can provide a wide range of treatments to address many health concerns including:

- Orthopedic injuries, including joint repair or replacement
- Wounds that are not healing well
- Reconditioning following surgery or a hospital stay
- Intravenous (IV) therapy (including long term IV therapy)
- Management of congestive heart failure, cancer or other chronic health conditions
- Respiratory problems
- Stroke/cerebral vascular accident

## During Your Stay

Our skilled, compassionate staff will create treatment plans based on best-practice standards, as well as the specific needs of patients and their family members.

As an added benefit, physical therapy is offered seven days a week. And, because our program is located within our hospital, we also have access to a physician every day if needed.

build strength, so you can gain independence and get back to your life. During your stay, you will be encouraged to wear your own clothing and bring photos or mementos from home. When you're not receiving medical treatment, you are welcome to visit with friends and family, participate in activities or simply rest. Physical, speech and occupational therapists, nurses, case managers, wound care professionals and respiratory care staff will work with you and your family in setting short and long-term goals.

Swing Bed Rehabilitation patients also have access to an Activities of Daily Living (ADL) suite that includes a full kitchen and laundry area. This unique, specialized area allows therapists to work with the patient on basic living skills like the ability to do their own laundry, reach needed items in kitchen cabinets and prepare simple meals. The ADL suite also helps the therapist determine what equipment needs to be
